



Dear Friends of Montgomery County Community Foundation—

Thank you for all of your interest and support of MCCF in 2021. Montgomery County Community Foundation creates and manages legacy gifts that offer scholarships and support the work of non-profits in and serving the residents of Montgomery County now and into the future.

Living through the challenges of 2020, and positioning for the "new normal", MCCF made some major gains in 2021. As of 12/31/21, the market value of Fund Corpus increased to over \$11,310,000. This was due to combination of generous donors creating and adding to existing funds, as well as diligent professional investing of the Fund Corpus.

During the year, the foundation distributed \$274,763 to Montgomery County charities, including funds to help people who were not able to work because of the arctic freeze we experienced in February 2021. In addition, MCCF distributed \$17,000 in scholarships to deserving students throughout Montgomery County. This continues a long history of charitable giving through MCCF. Including 2021, The Foundation has distributed over \$2,592,000 in scholarships and gifts to Montgomery County students and non-profits.

The Foundation raises funds to help cover the administrative costs through the MCCF Annual Shootout and the Annual Gifts of the Vine Wine Dinner. These two events raised over \$208,000 in 2021. Thanks to all who participated in these events as sponsors, donors, and volunteers.

Recognizing 2022 presents new challenges in the economy and the investment markets, MCCF continues to press ahead with a measured long term approach. The Foundation maintains a well-diversified, professionally managed, investment portfolio overseen by the Investment Committee of the Board. The Foundation also keeps ample funds available to provide the annual distributions to scholarships and non-profits.

Do you have a heart for charitable giving in Montgomery County? You can become involved through one of the wide range of Field of Interest Funds. These funds cover areas like Animal Welfare, The Arts, Health and Human Services, Education, Heritage, Civic and Cultural Activities, and The Environment. In addition, you can create your own funds with a minimum donation of \$15,000 payable over 5 years. These funds will be invested to provide distributions forever to the organization or cause that is most important to you. Don't forget you can add Montgomery County Community Foundation to your will to establish an endowment that will live far into the future.

Special thanks to all who continue to support the Montgomery County Community Foundation. Whether you participate as a donor, help with the fundraisers, a staff member, or volunteer, it is your efforts that make MCCF a success and position the organization to benefit Montgomery County residents for years to come.




(Income Tax Basis as of December 31, 2021)

Donor Advised Funds

The Rick and Rosalind Dauzat Endowment focuses on grants to support the arts and culture, education, and human services. Grants from this fund will be available in 2021.

The George and Emily Fath Fund for Human Needs provides financial assistance to the needlest in Montgomery County. Special consideration is given to people who have sudden unexpected needs due to sickness, injury, disability, death in the family, or natural disasters. The spirit of Mathew 25:31-46 will serve as a guide.

The Annie and Irvin Hoffman Memorial Fund provides grants to nonprofit organizations in Montgomery County with a special interest in programs for the elderly and children.

The Margaret and Foster Madeley Family Fund provides funding to help create and foster secure environments and programs to enable people to experience their potential to thrive.

The Dan H. and Martha Foster Madeley Heritage Fund provides grants to nonprofit agencies for researching, collecting, preserving and sharing the histories of Montgomery County residents.

The Metcalf Family Endowment Fund provides grants to benefit the people of Montgomery County

The Sowers Family Pre-K Literacy Fund provides funds to spark new and innovative programs that build literacy of Montgomery County's pre-kindergarten children.

The David and Jill Sharp Vaughan Family Fund meets the benevolent needs of Montgomery County citizens including, but not limited to animal welfare.

Field Of Interest Funds

The Arts & Culture Fund supports the performing and visual arts and culture in Montgomery County.

The Henry T. Brooks Endowed Memorial Fund to provide financial assistance to children up to 18 years of age, to feed the hungry, to aid senior citizens and help abused women.

The Susie and Jack Brouse Family Fund provides financial assistance to the needlest families in Montgomery County in the spirit of Matthew 25:31-46.

The Dale Buckalew Crane Fund financially assists children, youth and the elderly of Montgomery County.

The Disadvantaged People and Vulnerable People of Montgomery County Fund supports services, programs and initiatives for people in Montgomery County who find themselves facing distinct disadvantages or are vulnerable due to conditions or situations that may be lifelong or changes that happen in life.



The **The Dushkin Family Fund** was established to improve the lives of Montgomery County residents. The first grant from this fund will be awarded in 2023.

The Environment Preservation and Sustainability Fund supports the environment and ecology initiatives. This fund was established by the board for donors who care about long term funding for this issue and do not wish to establish their own fund. To date, it is not fully funded.

The Fostering Hope for Abused and Neglected Children Fund honors past MCCF executive director Shannon Kidd; her passion is helping abused and neglected children.

The Health and Wellness Fund supports physical and mental care needs including prevention and education. This fund was established by the board for donors who care about long term funding for this issue and do not wish to establish their own fund. To date, it is not fully funded

The **Dr. Jeffrey Kass, MD Elderly Assistance Fund** will support the indigent elderly in need by offering nutrition, medical care, medications, transportation assistance and companionship. The first grant from this fund will be awarded in 2022.

The Dr. Jeffrey Kass, MD Dog Rescue and Animal Welfare Fund ensures services such as fostering, veterinarian care, transportation and adoption are available to dog rescue groups and those caring for injured, abandoned, or abused animals. The first grant from this fund will be awarded in 2022.

The Long Term Disaster Recovery Fund helps residents recover from disaster in Montgomery County.

The Montgomery County Adult Literacy Fund furthers adult literacy in Montgomery County.

The Elsie Mae and Edward Everett Taylor Fund was created to provide financial assistance to the neediest citizens in Montgomery County with a special interest in the elderly.

The **Veterans Fund** is designed to support services, programs and initiatives for veterans.

The Woodlands Medical Center Foundation Fund supports "health care and wellness assistance and education, including shelter and medical or psychological screening, treatment, or counseling in South Montgomery County/The Woodlands area. Funding for capital improvements for buildings, improvements, furnishings, or equipment and/or related program expenses."

The Vernon Randolph Yeakley Animal Welfare Fund offers grants to promote the humane treatment of animals through community education and supporting responsible pet/animal ownership.

The Vernon Randolph Yeakley Endowment was established through his will to provide funding for homeless, hungry and needy people in Montgomery County.

The Youth/Children Fund offers support for education or enrichment programs, services and initiatives for children and young adults. This fund was established by the board for donors who care about long term funding for this issue and do not wish to establish their own fund. To date, it is not fully funded.

Unrestricted Funds

The Frankie Alexander Benevolent Fund was established by the MCCF Board of Directors to honor the Community Foundation's first executive director as a general benevolent fund to accept contributions in memory or honor of individuals.

The Buckalew Fund supports the non-profit community of Montgomery County.

The Jason and Marti Mann Family Fund provides flexible resources needed to support innovative responses to address the community's most pressing needs.

Agency & Designated Agency

The Alfred & Dollie Anderson Memory Park Maintenance Fund for improvements to and maintenance of Memory Park, managed by the Rotary Club of Lake Conroe grants to begin by 2022.

The Dave and Jo Ann Bartlow Fund benefiting CASA Child Advocates of Montgomery County.

The Morris Bateman Conroe Noon Lions Club Fund provides financial assistance to the Conroe Noon Lions Club Charities Fund to support the eye conservation program.

The Henry and Billie Brooks Endowment Fund provides funding for food distribution to nonprofit agencies in Montgomery County through the Montgomery County Food Bank.

The Crighton Theatre Fund focuses on "the preservation, maintenance, upkeep and expansion of the real property and improvements known as the Crighton Theatre located in Conroe, Montgomery County, Texas."

The **Memory Park Maintenance Fund** provides permanent funding for Memory Park which is adjacent to the Charles B. Stewart West Branch Library in Montgomery Texas.

The Metcalf Family Endowment – Assistance League of Montgomery County provides funds to the Assistance League for identifying and responding to the needs of Montgomery County's citizens to improve their quality of life.

The **Metcalf Family Endowment – Conroe Live** supports Conroe Live, an organization established to attract the arts, entertainment and education to revitalize downtown Conroe.

The **Metcalf Family Endowment – First Baptist Church** benefits the First Baptist Church, Conroe benevolent fund to meet benevolent needs in Conroe.

The Metcalf Family Endowment – Oscar Johnson, Jr. Community Center provides funds to the Center's volunteer board to support programs at the community center.

The MCCF Administrative Endowment Fund was established to help provide a permanent source of funding for Foundation expenses so the annual income of our other endowed funds can be maximized.

The Montgomery County Women's Center Fund was created to further the mission of preventing, protecting against and prevailing over domestic violence and sexual assault.

The **Montgomery ISD Fine Arts Endowment Fund** supports fine arts programming in Montgomery ISD schools.

The Michala Wunderlich Memorial Endowment Benefiting Coulson Tough School was created to support the teachers, classrooms and students that first year teacher Michala so loved.

The Vernon Randolph Yeakley Fund for Montgomery County Women's Center supports the mission of MCWC.

Scholarship Program

The Henry and Billie Brooks Scholarship at Lone Star College-Montgomery provides need-based scholarships to citizens of the United States of America, who are residents of Montgomery County and wish to attend Lone Star College-Montgomery. Piolo Soriano, a graduate from Conroe High School, will be studying nursing at Lone Star College Montgomery using the \$1,000 per semester scholarship over potentially four consecutive semesters of the Brooks scholarship.

The Keaton "KBuss" Bussell Memorial Scholarship Fund benefits a student at Montgomery High School, who along with academic performance demonstrate leadership, motivation, character, ability, citizenship and potential, in memory of Keaton "KBuss" Bussell. The family and community came together in November to launch the inaugural KBuss Memorial Golf Tournament to raise funds to expand this endowed scholarship. A portion of those funds were set aside to increase the number and size of the scholarships in 2022. Keaton's family was excited to award this \$1,000 scholarship to Lake Creek High School's Zachary Robin Downs, who is studying business at University of Concordia – Nebraska in 2021.

The **Shane Dickerson Carter Memorial Scholarship Fund** was created to benefit Montgomery High School seniors who have demonstrated the Rotary International mission of "Service Above Self".

This endowed scholarship fund was created by Rotarian Don Carter in memory of his beloved wife Shane Dickerson Carter. Two \$1,000 scholarships were awarded from this fund in 2021 to Montgomery High School seniors Rachel Marie Denner and Madison Alise Rodriguez.

The Mary Jane Hamilton Memorial Scholarship Fund benefits students from Montgomery County planning to attend Lone Star College-Montgomery. This need-based endowed scholarship fund was created in memory of Mary Jane Hamilton by her loving stepmother, Patti Harrison to honor Mary, an HISD elementary school teacher for 17 years. In 2021, four \$1,000 scholarships were presented to Caney Creek High School Senior Jennifer Clara Cardenas, Willis High School's Johnathan Hernandez, Oak Ridge High School's Walther Joseph Laureano, and Conroe High School senior Yadhira Valadez Nava.

The **Hivnor Family Scholarship Fund** benefits students of Willis High School participating in varsity athletics, including cheerleading and drill team. The commitment of the Hivnor Family emphasizes their strong belief in the importance of higher education. The 2021 scholarship for \$1,000 was awarded to Willis High School senior Marci N. Konen to attend Texas A&M to study biology.

The Ruben W. Hope, Jr. Memorial Scholarship was created by the Hope Family and friends to honor Ruben's passion for education and commitment to the people of Montgomery County. The scholarship for \$500 in memory of Ruben W. Hope, Jr was awarded in 2021 to Conroe High School senior Rhylee Shaw who is studying marketing at University of Texas.

The **Cort Martin Memorial Scholarship** at Lone Star College-Montgomery was established by combining the Cort Martin Scholarship Fund and the Montgomery College Fund. This need based scholarship is for Conroe ISD seniors planning to attend Lone Star College – Montgomery. It honors the memory of Cort Martin, son of Tim and Deanna Martin, who was tragically killed in an accident. A \$1,100 scholarship was awarded to Hanna DeVerse, senior from The Woodlands College Park High School for 2021, who is studying psychology.

The **Buddy Moorhead Memorial Scholarship** honors the memory of Conroe High School Football Coach Buddy Moorhead. Seniors selected for this award must have participated in football at Conroe High School, have a reasonable chance of success in college, be of good character, and must exemplify the "spirit" of the Conroe Tigers. This scholarship was supplemented by the Conroe Tiger Football Booster Club. Layne O'Dell was the 2021 recipient of this \$1,000.00 scholarship to attend Navarro College to study education.

The Alfred (Jimmie) and Joyce Soupart Scholarship is a need-based scholarship for students of Conroe High School. The Souparts believe that higher learning is the pathway to success a nd have created a legacy of commitment to higher education by providing needed funding. A scholarship of \$3,200 was awarded in 2021 to Conroe High School senior Mia Arnsworth who is studying biology at University of Texas at Arlington.

The Sowers Family All Means All Graduating Students Scholarship Fund supports Conroe ISD graduating students who have the drive to continue their education after high school and have challenges to overcome during their high school years. At the end of the 2020-2021 school year, at least one ninth grade student who will attend Conroe High School was selected to be awarded this incentive graduation scholarship in 2025.

The Texas Osteopathic Rural Initiative (TORI) Fund will fund over eight consecutive semesters to Sam Houston State University School of Osteopathic Medicine student(s) who plan to practice rural medicine upon completion of their degree. The first scholarship from this fund will be awarded in 2023.

All Ears! Listening & Language Center— \$10,530 to provide weekly Auditory Verbal Therapy sessions to 33% of the enrolled Montgomery County Children under 2 yrs. old at no charge.

Angel Reach—\$10,700 to expand the Angel Reach Foster Success initiative to include learning intervention sessions which will provide concentrated education to ensure success for our young people who struggle with learning difficulties.

Assistance League of Montgomery County —\$5,000 to provide new clothing and shoes to 40 students in need in all six Montgomery County School Districts.

Bridgewood Farms—\$4,250 to upgrade their Horticulture program by repairing and upgrading the heating and cooling systems in their newest greenhouse.

Community Assistance Center—\$10,000 to be used to provide program support for CAC's services including program delivery, client assistance and case management.

Compassion United —\$5,800 to update a building by repairing bathroom and adding a wall with door in order to offer free medical services with Interfaith Community Clinic and financial assistance through Community Assistance Center to the Groceville/Cut and Shoot community.

Conroe Live —\$5,100 to refurbish murals and art benches in Downtown Conroe, and operating costs.

Conroe Noon Lions Club-Charities Fund—\$1,800 for eye-sight conservation projects such as eyeglasses and eye exams for those in need in Conroe area.

Conroe Symphony Orchestra —\$2,900 for general operating and program support for the 2021/2022 season.

Coulson Tough PTO—\$700 to help new teachers at Coulson Tough.

Crighton Theatre Foundation— \$2,400 for renovation and repair expenses to the historic theatre.

Cypress – Woodlands Junior Forum—\$3,263 to underwrite their BookSmart Program's books for second graders in 5 Magnolia ISD and 20 CISD elementary schools.

Eagles Nest Ministries of Conroe—\$2,400 to pay two months of room, clothes, food, counseling services, program curriculum, staff wages and all bills including utilities, water, insurance for a homeless male parolee.

Education Based Housing, Inc.—\$2,500 to enrich lives of 275 seniors aging in place at Providence At Kuykendahl Court and Heritage Seniors.

FOB Rasor—\$1,500 to pay for two FOB Rasor signs – One 4 x 8' on the side of the building and one 4 x 8' at the street to advertise activities offered by FOB Rasor.



First Baptist Church of Conroe—\$4,900 for financial assistance such as rent, electricity or other necessary utilities for Montgomery County residents in need.

God's Garage—\$19,173 toward the construction of a new administration and auto repair center needed to increase operating efficiency and triple throughput to extend outreach and assist more single mothers, widows, and wives of deployed military in need of reliable transportation.

Henry's Home Horse and Human Sanctuary—\$6,000 to sponsor one of the rescued horses for a year including all their feed and supplements, preventative vet care, farrier, grooming, and training supplies and tack to make their work more comfortable.



Heritage Museum of Montgomery County—\$4,000 to collect 8 oral histories of early Montgomery County families, interview, and video tape the individuals, and professionally prepare the videos, archiving and preserving their histories.

Hope Disaster Recover—\$2,500 to support staff salary to coordinate grocery delivery to underserved people in Montgomery County.

Houston Community Toolbank—\$3,800 to help place remote pickup containers and expand delivery options that will increase tool lending in Montgomery County and the impact of charitable activity and volunteerism.

Inspiration Ranch—\$4,400 for training and continuing education of both Equine-Assisted Mental Health and Equine-Assisted Therapeutic Riding Staff Members.

Interfaith Community Clinic—\$5,000 to fund Interfaith Community Clinic's mobile services reaching high-need, low resource areas of the county by attracting new patients who will receive, at a minimum, one wellness visit each year, as well as follow-up visits, and treat and monitor chronic conditions.

Interfaith of The Woodlands—\$2,500 to help our Senior adult neighbors age in place with grocery delivery.

Journey Home—\$6,864 to pilot a Prenatal Nutrition program for past and present resident guest.

Joy Ride Center-\$2,000 to grade and prepare land to build an adaptive garden for JoyRide Center Preparatory Day Program attendees.

Lone Star Animal Welfare League—\$4,800 to offer spay/ neuter services to families, seniors, and veterans through their Fixing

Montgomery County Spay/Neuter Van that goes directly into the local communities and performs services on-site.

Love Fosters Hope—\$11,673 to pay the catering expenses of one of their four 2022 Children's Summer Camp for children 7 to 11 who are currently in foster care.

Montgomery County Food Bank—\$5,800 to support Food for Seniors program, including Senior Box program and Nutrition Education.

Montgomery County Women's Center —\$16,200 for operating funds.

Montgomery ISD Education Foundation—\$10,300 to underwrite teacher grants and awards in MISD classrooms that promote innovative, creative, and imaginary ways to learn that can subsequently be replicated across the district.

Montgomery ISD Fine Arts—\$3,000 to award grants to MISD Fine Arts teachers to enhance a current classroom/program.

Mosaics of Mercy—\$3,448 to produce and market the Hope Pieced Together Podcast including editing, podcast hosting platform, soundproofing of recording space, and the virtual recording platform.

New Caney New Horizons—\$3,499 to replace riding lawn mower lost to vandalization in 2018.

New Danville—\$5,000 to install easily accessible ice/hydration stations for the Wranglers.

Oscar Johnson Jr. Community Center Volunteers— \$4,900 for after school and summer day camp program and special events for the community and staff.



Rotary Club of Lake Conroe Foundation—\$2,900 to maintain Memory Park in Montgomery.

Sleep in Heavenly Peace—\$6,000 to pay for the supplies and materials needed to build and make 21 fully furnished twin beds.

Special Olympics Texas—\$4,600 to support programs for Special Olympics athletes with intellectual disabilities in Montgomery County Texas.

Stonebridge Food Pantry—\$1,000 to stock the pantry's freezers for food distribution to 160-180 families for one month.



Texas Prader-Willi Association—\$1,700 to upgrade and repair of the electrical system in order to meet code that will transform a garage of new Conroe group home into a recreation area.

Waste Not Want Not dba Keep US Fed Montgomery County—\$2,900 to provide 75 hours of staff time toward the acquisition of new volunteers and recipients living in under-represented populations in Montgomery County with increased service in Black and Hispanic communities.

MCCF Long Term Disaster Recovery Fund

Who would have ever thought that Montgomery County would be shut down for a week by a winter storm? In February 2021, a massive multi-day ice storm along with extensive below freezing temperatures completely shut Montgomery County down. Residents were not able to go to work — even remotely — because there was no electricity. Parts of Montgomery County's roads were iced over for several days, and electricity was out in some areas for over a week due to downed powerlines and iced-over power plants. People who work in hourly jobs lost precious hours of income and faced tough decisions about paying their rent or mortgage and feeding their family. The Montgomery County Community Foundation Board members quickly granted most of the remaining funds in the Long Term Disaster Recover Fund to Community Assistance Center to pay rent, mortgage, and utility bills and Montgomery County Food Bank to provide food to those who lost income during the arctic blast. Community Assistance Center assisted sixty-three households while Montgomery County Food Bank provided enough food to prepare 2,000 meals to county residents.

Keaton Bussell left a huge mark on the people he met. His love of his family, his generosity of spirit, and his love of sports, including fishing and hunting, molded him into a caring person who included everyone in his orbit. His philosophy on life was "Life is hard but living life with perseverance helps us to grow into stronger, more rounded individuals. In my senior year I've learned that my mistakes don't define me, they have molded me to become stronger and more well-rounded. No matter how hard it gets, don't give up." After his tragic death in an automobile accident on his way to work one month after graduating high school, his family established the Keaton "KBuss" Bussell Memorial Scholarship Fund for a graduating Montgomery High School or Lake Creek High School senior who exemplifies who Keaton was.

Keaton's family decided to increase the impact his scholarship could have by hosting a golf tournament. The First Annual KBuss Memorial Golf Tournament, held at Walden Country Club, was a tremendous success! The event raised \$56,000 so Keaton's family decided to offer two scholarships in 2022 — one at Montgomery High School and the other at Lake Creek High School and doubled each scholarship to \$2,000. After expenses, the balance was invested in Keaton's fund to continue growing for scholarships in the future. Congratulations to Keaton's Family who brought their community together to build on Keaton's legacy.
